



## Mersea Week 2025

### Notice of Race

### Sunday 10<sup>th</sup> to Friday 15<sup>th</sup> August 2025

Organising Authority

The races are organised jointly by West Mersea Yacht Club and Dabchicks Sailing Club known as the Joint Organising Authority.

The Joint Organising Authority has appointed the Mersea Week Committee as the Organising Committee for the event (RRS 89.1).

The notation '[NP]' in a rule means that a boat may not protest another boat for breaking that rule. This changes RRS 60.1.

#### **1 RULES**

- 1.1 The event is governed by the rules as defined by The Racing Rules of Sailing and the IRC Rules 2025 Parts A, B, and C shall apply.
- 1.2 RRS Appendix T, Arbitration, will apply.
- 1.3 Rule 40.1 shall apply at all times on the water for dinghy classes.[DP]
- 1.4 All documents including any amendments, pertaining to this event are available at [Mersea Week Online Notice Board](#)
- 1.5 In the case of conflict between the Notice of Race and the Sailing Instructions, SI's will take precedence. This changes rule 63.5 c.

#### **2 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS**

- 2.1 The Sailing Instructions will be published on the Official Notice Board after 7<sup>th</sup> August 2025.

#### **3 COMMUNICATION**

- 3.1 The Official Notice Board is located at [ONB](#). Notices posted on the notice boards in the West Mersea Yacht Club Long Room are advisory only.
- 3.2 While racing except in an emergency, a boat shall not make voice or data transmissions and shall not receive voice or data communications that is not available to all boats. [DP, NP]
- 3.3 On the water, the Race Committee may make courtesy broadcasts on VHF channels and/or WhatsApp Groups. Details of both will be given in the Sailing Instructions. Failure to broadcast information or broadcasting incorrect information will not be grounds for redress.

## **4 ELIGIBILITY**

4.1 The event is open to all boats of the following classes:-

### **4.1.1 IRC Class**

A keelboat with a valid 2025 IRC rating.

Boats shall submit a copy of their IRC certificate not later than 9th August 2025 via email to the Race office. No alteration to a boat's TCC will be permitted after this date, except as a result of a rating protest, or to correct Rating Authority errors.

IRC Rule 22.4.2 shall not apply. There will be no limitations on crew weight except as required for boats rated as one designs which shall comply with IRC Rule 22.4.1.

For the purpose of IRC Rules 21.1.5 (d) and (e) this regatta is on consecutive days and the sails carried shall remain the same.

### **4.1.2 Local Handicap Cruisers**

The handicaps used will be those issued by the Joint Handicap Committee.

### **4.1.3 White Sail Cruisers**

White Sail Fleet is intended to appeal to boats which are family cruisers crewed by friends and family with fewer than a full crew. The White Sail Fleet shall not use spinnakers or similar specific downwind sails. White Sail Fleets shall use Local Handicaps plus twenty points for no spinnakers.

### **4.1.4 Classic and Gaff Rigged Yachts**

The Mersea Week definition of a Classic Yacht for the purposes of this event, this should be a Mono-Hull yacht of a 'Classic Yacht' style and constructed of any material. The Committee reserves the right to refuse any entry for the Classic Yacht event which in their opinion fails to comply with the spirit of a 'Classic Yacht'. Such entries may race in other appropriate classes.

### **4.1.5 National Sonata Class**

This class will race as a one design class and in accordance with the current National Sonata Class rules. [DP]

### **4.1.6 Smacks**

The handicaps used and the fleet split (Fast/Slow) will be those issued by the local Smacks Handicap Committee.

### **4.1.7 Dinghies and Catamarans**

The dinghy class is open to boats of any recognized monohull dinghy class with a current Portsmouth Yardstick Number of 1450 to 925.

The performance class is open to boats of any recognised dinghy class with a current Portsmouth yardstick number of 926 or less.

The handicaps used will be the RYA Portsmouth Yardstick System (Dinghy Classes), PY look alike of SCHRS (small catamaran classes).

### **4.1.8 Mersea Fisherman's Open Boats**

This Class will also be governed by the Class Rules and safety regulations of the Mersea Fisherman's Open Boat Association. For details please contact: - Oliver Grogan.

4.2 The handicaps used will be those issued by the Mersea Fisherman's Open Boat Association.

4.3 The Class divisions, in Local Handicap Cruisers, Local Handicap Cruisers White Sail and Classic Yacht and Gaff Rigged Yachts will be at the sole discretion of the Mersea Week Committee.

4.4 Classic and Gaff Rigged Yachts the handicaps used will be those issued by the Joint Handicap Committee.

4.5 Dinghy classes only, Helm substitution of the registered sailor is not permitted.

4.6 Sailors aged under 18 on the first day of the event will need to have a Parent/Guardian Declaration Form completed and signed by a parent or guardian, to confirm that the parent/guardian understands and accepts that their sailors are entirely responsible throughout the event for themselves and their boats on land and on the water. Forms must be completed online via the event website.

- 4.7 Parents or Guardians of people under the age of 18 must be confident in their child’s ability to sail in the prevailing conditions and without support services. They should not permit their child to start or to continue to race if they are in any doubt as to their child’s ability.
- 4.8 The responsible adult and competitor shall register together as shown in NOR 8.1.
- 4.9 To be considered an entry in the event, a boat shall complete all registration requirements and pay all fees.

- 5.2 The early entry fee is available for all entries up to midday 31<sup>st</sup> May 2025.
- 5.3 Entry closes at midday on 3rd August 2025.
- 5.4 All entries after the entry closing date are at the discretion of the Organising Authority and shall be charged late entry fees.
- 5.5 Keelboat entry fees include mooring fees from 9<sup>th</sup> to 15<sup>th</sup> August 2025 inclusive. Mooring fees outside those dates shall be paid by the boat.
- 5.6 All entries must be made online by paying the appropriate fee and completing the online entry form available on the event website
- 5.7 Should the event be cancelled, a refund of at least 80% of the entry fee will be made after transfer fees. This will be dependent on the expenditure committed to by, and at the discretion of the Organising Authority.
- 5.8 Competitor cancellation:

## 6 CREW SUBSTITUTION [DP]

- 6.1 For Dinghy classes only. Boats shall sail with the crew declared at registration. Any change or substitution to the registered crew must have the prior approval of the Race Committee.

## 7 ADVERTISING

- 7.1 Boats may be required to display advertising chosen and supplied by the Organising Authority. [DP]

8.6 On the last scheduled day of racing no warning signal will be made after 15:00.

8.7 Each day succeeding races will be started as soon as practicable after the finish of the previous race.

## 9 EQUIPMENT INSPECTION [DP]

9.1 Boats may be inspected at any time.

9.2 Competitors sailing in Cruiser Fleets shall, before racing, deposit a Safety Declaration (contained within the entry form and on the event website) with WMYC or the Mersea Week Committee.

9.3 **All Cruisers** shall carry the following safety equipment:

- Lifejackets, one per crew member
- Lifebuoy with whistle and drogue attached
- Second means of propulsion (Inboard, Outboard, Paddle)
- Handheld or permanently installed VHF able to be operated from on deck
- Foghorn
- Echo sounder or lead line
- Fire Extinguisher
- Anchor and rode suitable for securing the vessel
- First aid kit
- Marine compass
- A means to detach the rigging from the chainplate
- Bucket and lanyard
- Waterproof flashlight

- Suitable knife accessible from the deck effective for cutting sheets and halyards
- Heaving and towing line

9.4 **MFOBs** must comply with the specific safety requirements set out in the MFOB Sailing Instructions 2025:

- Mandatory Items
- Lifejackets or buoyancy aids for all crew members
- A suitable anchor and warp
- A bucket
- Adequate buoyancy, with the aim of keeping the boat in an upright position when swamped
- A painter 1.5 times length of boat with a float tied to the end

## 10 VENUE

10.1 The intended racing area will be The Blackwater Estuary and its creeks.

10.2 When racing in the creeks of Mersea competitors shall keep a good lookout for all manoeuvring vessels.

## 11 COURSES

11.1 The courses to be sailed will be detailed in the Sailing Instructions.

## 12 PENALTY SYSTEM

12.1 For all classes RRS 44.1 is changed so that only one turn, including one tack and one gybe, is required.

## 13 SCORING

13.1 Three races are required to be completed to constitute a series.

13.2 Local Handicap Class, Local Handicap Class (White Sail), Smacks, Classic and Gaff Rigged Yachts will be scored as a single series.

13.3 When fewer than 4 races have been completed, a boats series will be the total of her race scores.

13.4 When four (4) five (5) or six (6) races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst result. When seven (7) or eight (8) have been sailed, a boats series score will be the total of her races excluding her two (2) worst results.

## 14 SUPPORT PERSON VESSEL

14.1 There are no support boats for this event, only official boats.

## 15 BERTHING AND LAUNCHING [DP, NP]

15.1 Boats shall be kept in their assigned area of the dinghy park or mooring during the championship from the start of their event until the completion of the final race.

15.2 MFOB and Dinghy Fleets Tally-on/Tally-off. All skippers in these classes shall tally-on and tally-off using the appropriate WhatsApp group before and after racing each day. Details of the WhatsApp group will be set out in the Sailing Instructions for each class.

## 16 DATA PROTECTION

16.1 The personal information you provide to the Organising Authority will be used to facilitate your participation in the event. If you have agreed to be bound by the Racing Rules of Sailing and the other rules that govern the event (the rules), the legal basis for processing that personal information is contract. If you are not bound by the rules, the legal basis for processing that personal information is legitimate interest. Your personal information will be

stored and used in accordance with the Organising Authority's privacy policy. When required by the rules, personal information may be shared with the RYA, Racingrulesofsailing.org your National Authority and/or World Sailing. The results of the event and the outcome of any hearing or appeal may be published.

## **17 RISK STATEMENT**

- 17.1 Rule 3 of the Racing Rules of Sailing states: "The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue racing is hers alone." Sailing is by its nature an unpredictable sport and therefore inherently involves an element of risk. By taking part in the event, each competitor agrees and acknowledges that:
- 17.1.1 They are aware of the inherent element of risk involved in the sport and accept responsibility for the exposure of themselves, their crew and their boat to such inherent risk whilst taking part in the event.
- 17.1.2 They are responsible for the safety of themselves, their crew, their boat, and their other property whether afloat or ashore.
- 17.1.3 They accept responsibility for any injury, damage or loss to the extent caused by their own actions or omissions.
- 17.1.4 Their boat is in good order, equipped to sail in the event and they are fit to participate.
- 17.1.5 The provision of a race management team, patrol boats if any and other officials and volunteers by the event organiser does not relieve them of their own responsibilities.
- 17.1.6 The provision of patrol boat cover if any is limited to such assistance, particularly in extreme weather conditions, as can practically be provided in the circumstances.
- 17.1.7 It is their responsibility to familiarise themselves with any risks specific to this venue or this event drawn to their attention in any rules or information produced for the venue or event and to attend any competitor briefing held for the event.

## **18 INSURANCE**

- 18.1 Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of £3 million per event or equivalent.

## **19 RIGHTS TO USE NAMES AND LIKENESS**

- 19.1 Competitors automatically grant to the Organising Authority without payment the right in perpetuity to make, use and show any motion pictures, still pictures and live, taped or filmed television of or relating to the event.

## **20 PRIZES**

- 20.1 Details of daily and overall prizes and trophies to be awarded are set out on the event website.
